Urban Habitat Program with Verde & Columbia Slough Watershed Council



This hexter was the start of exciting project that MYC does with our partner Verde and the Columbia Slough Watershed Council every year...building gardens and Naturescapes! On Thursdays, we headed out to different properties in the Cully and North Portland neighborhoods to build one of these gardens to prevent environmental degradation in these areas. By building these rain gardens and Naturescpaes, we are promoting the natural filtration of rainwater from impervious surfaces, while also planting and supporting the life of native plants in Oregon!

More hikes! Maya took us to these cool spots on the west side of Portland. We were able to do more plant identification and use our binoculars to point out bird life.



Amphibian Egg Mass Surveys with the City of Gresham

During this hexter, we started a new project with the City of Gresham doing amphibian egg mass surveys! We went out to a pond in Gresham to look for frog and salamander eggs. Doing these surveys help to monitor the health of the ecosystem around them, as well as native amphibian populations. It was so cool to walk through the waters in our waders and hold the eggs. We even found a rare reg-legged frog too!





Bareroot Planting with Columbia Slough Watershed Council

started bareroot our plantings with Max from the Columbia Slough Watershed Council this hexter as well. So far, we have planted over 500 bareroots along the Slough! Doing these plantings essential to creating healthier waterway. Once the bareroots grow taller, they will create shade on the Slough. With cooler waters, the Slough can support more aquatic life, as well as create a natural area for other wildlife! These are especially crucial in urban and industrial areas!
